Subject: Recommendation for Implementing Traffic Calming Measures in Central Saanich

Over the years, the municipality has received numerous letters from residents raising concerns about speeding within our community.

Recent studies, such as the Capital Regional District's <u>Active and Safe Routes to School Final</u> <u>Report 2018</u>, have identified major issues related to high speeds, limited visibility, and inadequate pedestrian infrastructure.

Furthermore, at the February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024, council meeting members of the Central Saanich Community Association (CSCA) submitted two letters of concern from neighborhood groups regarding the portion of Wallace Drive south of Brentwood Village.

To address these issues, the Central Saanich Community Association strongly urges Central Saanich to adopt a traffic calming policy similar to the one recently implemented in Langford.

This article from The Westshore: <u>Slower, safer roads coming to Langford</u><sup>2</sup> provides some key takeaways from the Langford Traffic calming policy Langford. The traffic calming policy in full can be found here: <u>City of Langford Traffic Calming Policy</u>.<sup>3</sup>

The Langford policy is advantageous as it establishes specific criteria and measures for managing traffic calming issues in accordance with the Transportation Association of Canada (TAC) and the Canadian Guide to Traffic Calming. Key criteria include the proximity to schools, lack of sidewalks or pedestrian separation, and traffic speeds exceeding the posted limit by 10 km/h.

Due to recent shifts in provincial housing policies that will result in increased population density, now is an ideal time to implement a similar traffic calming policy in Central Saanich.
