**Subject:** Traffic Calming Request – Verling Avenue

Dear Mayor, Council and Engineering Team,

We appreciate the installation of the traffic calming bump on the west side of Hilltop Road along Verling Avenue. It is a positive step toward improving safety in our neighborhood.

We are writing to request additional traffic calming measures along Verling Avenue, particularly on the east side of Hilltop Road. While we understand that placing a single bump at the crest of the hill may not be ideal, we believe additional measures would significantly improve safety.

Specifically, we propose installing three to four smaller speed bumps along Verling Avenue. One could be placed on the west side of Hilltop Road, with three additional bumps spaced along Verling between 1851 and 1701 Verling Avenue.

We suggest positioning these bumps beyond the fabricating shop, as larger trucks servicing that location—and the [REDACTED] that have already impacted the road—would be less affected. This approach would help balance traffic flow while still addressing safety concerns.

Verling Avenue is increasingly used as a cut-through route, and we are experiencing a growing volume of traffic traveling at high speeds throughout the day and night. This has become a significant safety concern for residents.

We appreciate your consideration of this request and welcome the opportunity to discuss possible solutions further. We look forward to your response.
